

Join us as Ruth McGuffin leads us in a brief look at the Book of Exodus. Ruth comes to us from a lifetime of learning. Trained as a Synodical Deacon, Ruth has spent much of her life in the study of the Bible and wants to share with us another of the wonderful publications available from the ELCA: Books of Faith.

In the book of Exodus, we learn that God prepares, calls, leads and forgives a chosen people - then and now. With Ruth we will consider some of the stories from Exodus and explore how the themes of these stories continue to be central to our lives today. Some themes of Exodus she will look at are

1. A Page is Turned: How is God preparing us to continue the story?
2. Discerning the Call: Why me? Couldn't someone else go instead?
3. A Plague on Your House: How is God at work in human history?
4. Let My People Go! How does God lead and provide for the needs of all?
5. Laying Down the Law: What does God expect from us?
6. Don't Have a Cow! How does God deal with those who fail to meet expectations?
